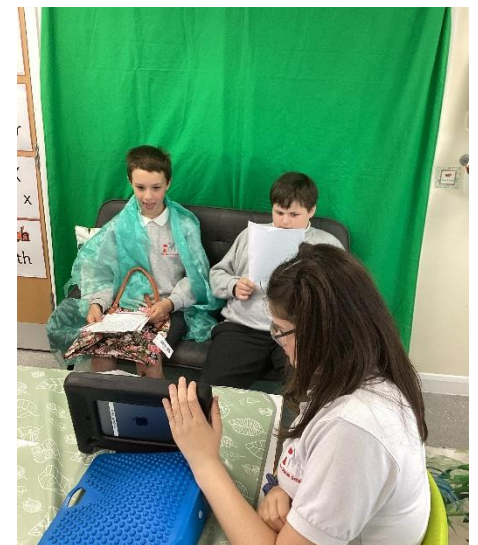

## Outdoor Learning

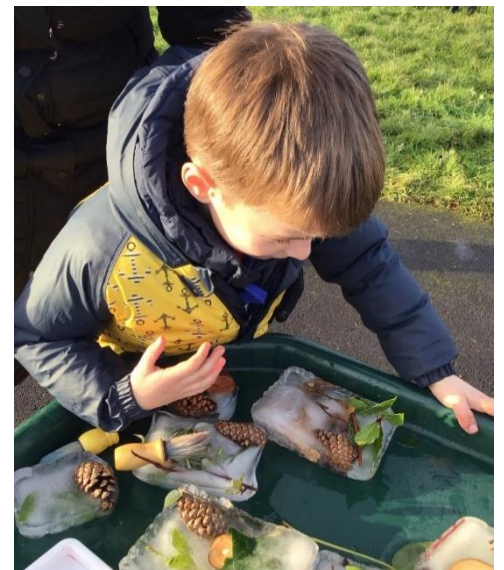
Outdoor learning is an important part of our curriculum. The pupils develop the following core attitudes for learning:

Our Sixth Formers have shown great resilience and bravery completing adventurous activities as part of their residential at Winmarleigh.



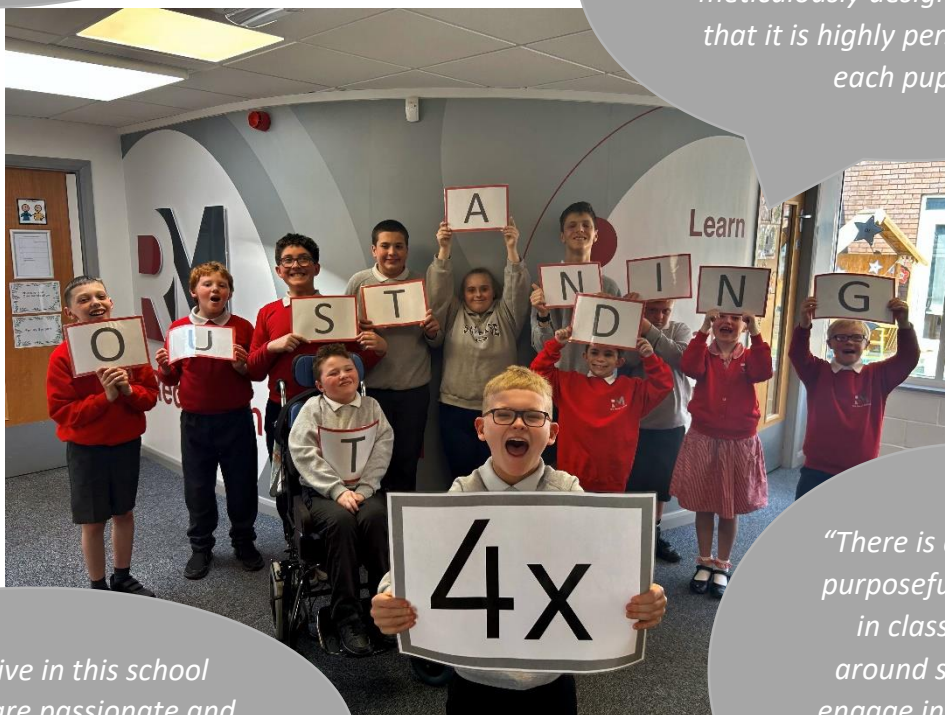
